

HISTORY OF COLDWATER COMMUNITY THEATER

The actors known as the Coldwater Players was formed in the 1940's. In the late 1960's, the troup enjoyed a brief revival as the Coldwater Community Theater.

Robert J. Pickering's play SLIGHT EXAGGERATION came to the stage in 1979, and CCT has been an active organization ever since.

The ROBERT J. PICKERING AWARD FOR PLAYWRIGHTING EXCELLENCE formed in 1984, the first presentation was in 1985. That same year CCT began producing musicals.

In 1987, CCT initiated it's four performance season; in the fall of 1990, we joined with the crew at Hillsdale Community Theater to produce - perform the musical *1776*.

91-92 marks the 13th consecutive season for Coldwater Community Theater. We are made up entirely of volunteers who love applause. We meet the first Tuesday of the month at 7:30 p.m. at Charlie's II. Please join us!

THE ROBERT J. PICKERING AWARD FOR PLAYWRIGHTING EXCELLENCE

With the presentation of "TO WIT" the Coldwater Community Theater has produced ten original plays. When the award was initiated in 1984, the three Pickering shows produced in 1979, 1981 and 1984 were the first recipients.

Beginning in 1985, the actual award was presentation of the manuscript. To most new authors this is better than money! In 1987 monetary awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place were added. The AWARD is now international and enjoys a outstanding reputation. This year the Committee will be accepting original unproduced musicals. CCT is proud to be the only amateur theater group in Michigan to offer this program.

THE AUTHOR

Joan Garner has been involved in theater at the school level and later in community service all of her life. After moving to Slidell Louisiana in 1973 to secure new employment, Miss Garner wandered into the local community theater and has been there ever since. Specializing in set design, Joan also works on every aspect of play production backstage, has directed five productions and has served on the Slidell Little Theater Board of Directors.

Supporting a flare for story and dialogue, Miss Garner has turned her skit writing skill of earlier years towards composing her full production pieces. To date, she has written eight plays with "Shenanigans", "Bravado!" and "To Wit" successfully produced.

Quitting her "9 to 5" job in 1989, Joan has devoted the past two years to distributing her plays and working on others. Her play "Bravado" won 2nd place in the 1990 PICKERING competition.
